
#### **Cherry Orchard Primary School**

Attendance Procedures

#### Attendance Matters:

At Cherry Orchard Primary School, we believe that good attendance is vital for all children to be confident, happy and independent learners. Good attendance is 97% or above – no more than 6 days off school in a year. Our aim is to give a clear and consistent message to parents/carers and children in our school, which we will constantly reinforce in our day-to-day work.

Good attendance is a priority at Cherry Orchard and our target is to achieve 97% or above by the end of this academic year. It is an expectation that all children attend school every day because 'Every minute of every day matters'.




#### What is expected of Parents and Carers at Cherry Orchard Primary School:

- Good attendance Parents/carers have a legal duty to ensure that their child/children are in school every day as it is vital for learning and promoting essential life skills
- Good punctuality Parents/carers have a responsibility to ensure that their child/children
  arrive on time each day in school (so lessons can start at 8:45asm) and are prepared for
  the day ahead
- Medical/Hospital/Dental Appointments Where possible, and unless in an emergency situation, appointments should be taken outside of school hours or in holiday periods.
   Appointment letters/notifications should be provided to the school office when notifying us of the absence.
- Absences due to illness Parents/carers have a duty to notify the school if their child/children are absent for any reason and this needs to be done as soon as possible and certainly before 9:15am. School will contact parents/carers if notification is not received by this time.
- Holidays Holidays are not permitted in school term time. All holidays are unauthorized except in exceptional circumstances.

We wished a Cherry-bye to Mrs Brunt as she 'rebalances' her life and leaves the Rivers MAT for some well-earned 'me-time'.

She had a lovely morning in school, being sung to in Assembly, visiting the classes and chatting with the children, and was really impressed with how smart our school building and children are looking, and with how hard the children are working.









We added the furniture to our 'new space' this week. It really makes the place cheerful. The children have enjoyed trying it out.

We have put our crisp packet and dental recycling points into this new area. Keep helping us to fill these to help our environment.





We have taken delivery of a big, red collection box which is sited just inside the main school gates.

Let's make it go clang!




Reception children have been writing and blending their sounds this week. What wonderful work for week 3.









Year 1 made their first visit to Forest School this week.






They explored and found some new spaces and a new bridge. They also had a go at mark making using natural sources.










Year 3 have been focusing on running skills in PE, thinking about how our bodies move as we increase speed, and on making cardboard levers using split pins in D&T.






Year 4 have been partitioning numbers to 10,000 in maths and thinking about communication when working as a team in their PE sessions this week.

#### **Reminders/information**

Help us to increase funding for our school – by booking your free school meal.



Thursday 5 October 2023 is the National School Census Day. The vital funding that we receive from the Government to support your child's development in school will be based on the number of children recorded as having a school meal on this day.

To maximise our school funding, we would encourage all families with children entitled to a Free School Meals and Universal Infant Free School Meal (every child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) to enjoy their free meal on Thursday 5 October 2023, rather than bringing a packed lunch that day.

Please book your school meal on Parent Pay by 8:45am on Thursday 5th October.

Please can we encourage as many as possible to commit to eating the school dinner on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> October as this will ensure our school receives the best possible funding for the year!

#### Do you receive benefits or financial support?

If so, your child may be entitled to Free School Meals. For each eligible child, the school receives funding for the next six years, even if your financial situation changes.

#### **Reminders/information**

School gates open at 8:30am and will close when children should be in class at 8:45am. This is when lessons start and the register is taken. The gates will be open again at 3:05pm for a 3:10pm finish for Reception children and a 3:15pm finish for all other year groups. Please try to be prompt in the mornings so that all opportunities for learning are able to be taken and in the afternoons by standing away from the building, close to the areas where your child will be released.



Please do NOT try to park in the back car park if picking children up from clubs or The Hub. This is a staff only car park as it is small and does not have much room to turn cars around.

ALSO please try NOT to drive down Timberdine Close in the mornings unless you have a parking permit for the school as there are not places to turn safely around. We have been asked to pass on that the NHS have had their entrances blocked and there have been some near misses with both children and vehicles, and, as a result, the community police officers will be doing some spot patrols.
