

Attendance Procedures

Attendance Matters:

At Cherry Orchard Primary School, we believe that good attendance is vital for all children to be confident, happy and independent learners. Good attendance is 97% or above – no more than 6 days off school in a year. Our aim is to give a clear and consistent message to parents/carers and children in our school, which we will constantly reinforce in our day-to-day work.

Good attendance is a priority at Cherry Orchard and our target is to achieve 97% or above by the end of this academic year. It is an expectation that all children attend school every day because 'Every minute of every day matters'.



What is expected of Parents and Carers at Cherry Orchard Primary School:

- Good attendance Parents/carers have a legal duty to ensure that their child/children are
 in school every day as it is vital for learning and promoting essential life skills
- Good punctuality Parents/carers have a responsibility to ensure that their child/children
 arrive on time each day in school (so lessons can start at 8:45asm) and are prepared for
 the day ahead
- Medical/Hospital/Dental Appointments Where possible, and unless in an emergency situation, appointments should be taken outside of school hours or in holiday periods.
 Appointment letters/notifications should be provided to the school office when notifying us of the absence.
- Absences due to illness Parents/carers have a duty to notify the school if their child/children are absent for any reason and this needs to be done as soon as possible and certainly before 9:15am. School will contact parents/carers if notification is not received by this time.
- Holidays Holidays are not permitted in school term time. All holidays are unauthorized except in exceptional circumstances.

NB Christmas parties will be held in year groups at a time that suits each group and parents and children will be informed of these closer to the time.
















Reception learned all about hibernating hedgehogs and then made some in Forest School, using Autumn leaves! It was great fun and we were proud our pictures.











Today in their English lesson, Year 3 were introduced to inverted commas and learnt how they are added to sentences to show speech.









Year 5 have been focusing on addition and subtraction in Maths. We have been practising formal methods, looking at relationships between numbers and finding fact families.









There will also be an orchestra club on a Friday after school for those already learning an instrument. Separate information will be sent out about this soon, as it is in collaboration with Mrs Daws.





WORRY TIME

Set aside a time each day for your child worry. Discuss with your child how long the worry time will be for. In this time your child can write down their worries, discuss them with your or problem solve to overcome them

THOUGHT CHALLENGING

Help your child to write down any unhelpful thoughts they that experience. Try to challenge them with your child and come up with more realistic and helpful ones

ACTIVITY PLANNING

Create an activity diary with your child and help them to schedule in some pleasurable and achievement related activities

TALKING ABOUT FEELINGS

Why not create a time each week where your child can speak to you about their thoughts and feelings

3 GOOD THINGS

Before bed spend some time with your child to identify and write down three good things they achieved from the day


WELLBEING

Support your child to look after their wellbeing. Cook healthy meals with them, exercise or play sport with them and make sure they are getting enough sleep

IMAGERY

Work with your child to imagine themselves in an imaginary future where everything has turned out in a positive way


