Sport Premium funding – Evidencing the Impact

The 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

- 1- Increased confidence, knowledge, and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 2- The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- 3- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer (CMO) guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
- 4- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5- Increased participation in competitive sport.
