We will have a new attendance policy out soon, as a MAT. It is based on the updated Government guidance that came into force at the end of August. The Department of Education states that the Headteacher may not grant any leave of absence during school term time unless there are very exceptional circumstance. 
Please try to discourage the bringing of toys/non-school items into school. They can go missing or get broken, meaning the children can get upset. Please keep them for home.



It's onwards and upwards to the next set of trials.




YEAR R







We have also been developing our fine motor skills by using pipettes to squeeze small amounts of primary colours together to make secondary colours. Science, physical development and Art all in one!




